Q: Your last 108 message contained

"In cases provided for in paragraph 3 of Article 18 of this Law, the owner is prohibited from evicting tenants within ten years from the date of restoration of property rights. Metrica is an installation that revolves around the psychic malfunctioning of a building management system. Dipping into a pool of text sourced from Lithuanian state archives—records and bureaucratic documents of property from the 14th-17th centuries and 1990s post-Soviet land reform—the receipt printer at the center of the installation documents a stream of queries to a large language model as the system decides whether it should turn the lights of the institution on or off. Obsessively sorting through the historical texts it has been fed, the thermal printer generates a cascade of receipts, no two the same, regurgitating and rationalizing fragments of these official histories, which it seems to have mistaken for its own memories. Rippling outward from the receipt printer, the institution's reading room becomes an extension of the building's psychic, literary struggle. The extended mise-en-scene of the library suggests states of deep storage: certain books are ceremonially sealed and packed, while others seem to have lost their sense of stability as the images on their dust jackets slide off at oblique angles; a photograph of an excavated cellar—now covered by a one-to-one replica of the Palace of the Grand Dukes of Lithuania constructed after the fall of the Iron Curtain—floats on the wall; and the conference room video monitor is stuck on a bucolic scene that is arrested at either dawn or twilight; all drenched by the metronomic flickering of fluorescent lights tinted by a day to night effect and the rhythmic sound of the receipt printer.



GLOSSARY

alienated intelligence (AI) one that appears to be filmed at night. Employing filters, special lighting, or other visual effects that create an illusion of darkness, the technique was often employed in the era of silent films, with prints being tinted blue to achieve a simulation of “moonlight blue,” mimicking an effect of the retina that shifts perception of low-light scenes towards the cooler end of the spectrum.

EXAMPLE
To achieve a moody and unsettling atmosphere with less sensitive film, 1940s film noir directors often shot day for night.

historiography

the study of written history and the writing of history. This includes a study of the methods, assumptions, and biases that shape the writing and interpreting of history. Historiography is concerned with critical questions such as: who writes history; why are certain events and people included or excluded from historical registers; and how historical narratives are constructed and interpreted.

building management system (BMS).

a computer-based control system that monitors and manages the mechanical, electrical, and electromechanical services in a building. Designed to optimize the performance of building systems such as heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC), lighting, and security, the BMS ensures that each of the systems under its control operate efficiently and effectively. The BMS can also monitor energy usage and provide data for energy management and sustainability reporting. Power dynamics and management can come into play with BMS, as it is used to centrally control and monitor systems, enabling surveillance or control by a single authority.

refers to a type of artificial intelligence (AI) algorithm trained to find patterns

possession

sits as the intersection of the concepts of haunting and ownership. In this context, haunting refers to the presence or influence of a person or entity, often involving a sense of lingering attachment or control. Ownership, on the other hand, implies a legal or rightful claim over something, such as property or an object. These concepts combine in the idea of possession, where an individual or entity exerts control over something, either physically or metaphorically. This can manifest in various ways, from the legal ownership of property to the idea of a person being “possessed” or influenced by a supernatural force. Possession encompasses the complex and multifaceted nature of control, attachment, and influence.

skew

As a verb, skew means “to move obliquely,” describing an action or motion that deviates from a straight or linear path. This can refer to the way an object is positioned or oriented, creating a visual impression of asymmetry or distortion. As a concept in statistics, skewness measures the asymmetry of a probability distribution. A distribution is said to be skewed if it is not symmetric and has a tail on one side that is longer or fatter than the other.

Metrica details records of land transactions from these periods, including the names of landowners, their families, and their ancestors. These records were used to determine land ownership and inheritance rights, as well as to track the movement of people and goods across the territory of the GDL. Held for a period in the 1500s at the Lower Castle in Vilnius, the books were copied, destroyed, stolen, and lost through numerous wars and political occupations over the centuries. Microfilm records of the over 600 books are preserved at the Lithuanian State Historical Archives in Vilnius, and are digitally scanned and accessible to the public.

Palace of the Grand Dukes of Lithuania (Lietuvos Didžiosios Kunigaikštystės valdovų rūmai Vilniaus žemutinėje pilyje)
a reconstructed historical palace in Vilnius, Lithuania, located on the original excavated foundations of the Lower Castle—a palace originally built in the 15th century as the residence of the Grand Duke of Lithuania, and served as a center for administration, storage, and record-keeping for the Chancellery of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania (GDL). The place has been destroyed and rebuilt several times; sporadic archeological excavations of the site were conducted in 1964 during the Soviet occupation, and continued (underfunded) during the 1990s. In the early 2000s, the palace was fully reconstructed as a museum that showcases its own role in the history and culture of Lithuania.

literary unconscious, the

“Eloquent testimony to Freud’s success as a lawgiver in his own right, the unconscious sway of psychoanalysis as an arbiter of modern thought and a staple of therapeutic practice represents the consummate kind of success any mythological system or set of imaginative texts can have. Lithuanian Metrica or the Metrica of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania or "Lietuvos Metrika"
(from the Latin ‘matricula’, or ‘‘office book,’’ and Polish ‘metryka’, or ‘archive’)

is a set of historical documents that encode and structure foundational regimes of land ownership and property in Lithuania. A collection of legal documents produced by the Chancellery of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania (GDL), written primarily in Old Ruthenian (followed later by Polish and Latin), the

the received, unacknowledged, sedimented heritage of myth, literature, technical regulations, and everyday language. When assigned to a sphere distinct from the world, a realm of representation and not of reality, language reappears as a haunted, alien intelligence. land reform (Lithuania, post-Soviet)

refers to a series of legislative and administrative measures that were implemented in Lithuania after the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991. The main goal of the reform was to restore private ownership of land, which had been abolished during the Soviet era. The reform involved the redistribution of state-owned land to private individuals and legal entities, as well as the creation of a new legal framework for land ownership and use. The reform had a significant impact on the social, economic, and political landscape of Lithuania, as it allowed for the emergence of a new class of landowners and entrepreneurs.
